Video Game Industry

Video game companies earn over £50 billion every year and there are many companies that you can work for, such as: Nintendo, Sony, Microsoft and many others.

If you want to be a video game developer you have to be creative and hard working as a game can take several months or even years to produce. There are many stages before a game is released, from creating ideas and characters to programming and testing. There are various tasks involved at each stage, so your role could be, for example:

DESIGNER – deciding what a game looks like and how it plays. You would either come up with your own original ideas or work from an existing concept (idea).

ARTIST – creating the game's visual characters, objects and scenery, and producing concept art and drawings (storyboards) at the planning stage.

ANIMATOR – bringing the characters, objects and scenery to life with computer modelling and animation software during the production stage.

PROGRAMMER – creating the code to make the game work. You could specialise in developing graphics, artificial intelligence (AI), or gameplay software.

A video game designer works with animators, artists, programmers and producers to create a fully functional video game. They work 35 hours a week, however they may work longer to meet deadlines.

To be a video game designer you need to be: creative, good with software, understand your target audience (11+) and problem solving. There are about 6600 game designers in the UK today due to it being a really good job with good money, it's also one of the best jobs on the planet and is very interesting.

The creators can use a lot of imagination to expand the game because your imagination lasts FOREVER! With this, you can make anything you want.
