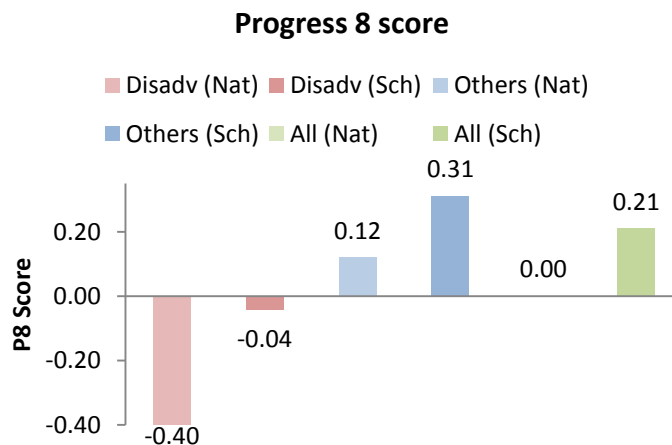


Pupil Premium: Additional funding is provided to the academy in the form of a pupil premium to help close the gap in attainment and progress between Disadvantaged and Other pupils. Disadvantaged pupils are defined as those who have been eligible for free school meals in the last six years; or, Looked after continuously for 1 day or more; or, Adopted from Care. From a year group of 278 pupils, 73 pupils have been categorised as entitled to pupil premium funding.

Pupil premium funding has clearly benefitted disadvantaged pupils as evidenced below:

Progress 8 (P8):

- Disadvantaged pupils P8 score is close to national for All pupils, at -0.04.
- Nationally, Disadvantaged pupils P8 score is -0.40, (SFR 01/2016) and Others is 0.12, revealing a national P8 score gap of half a grade (0.52). The progress gap is smaller when comparing the schools’ P8 score for Disadvantaged pupils against other pupils nationally (0.16 v 0.52).
- Strong pupil premium performance is seen by prior middle attaining pupils as they outperform Others’ nationally (+0.15 v +0.14 nat).
- In particular, the English element of P8 sees Disadvantaged high prior attaining pupils outperform Others nationally (+0.18 v +0.05 nat).
- The Open element also shows the impact of funding as overall Disadvantaged pupils outperform Other pupils nationally (+0.28 v +0.11 nat).
- The Open element shows significant (top 10%) performance by prior middle attaining Disadvantaged pupils as they almost half a grade above their Other pupils nationally (+0.61 v +0.13 nat).
- Moreover, the Open element shows prior high attaining pupils have also done well as they also perform above Others nationally (+0.13 v +0.07 nat).



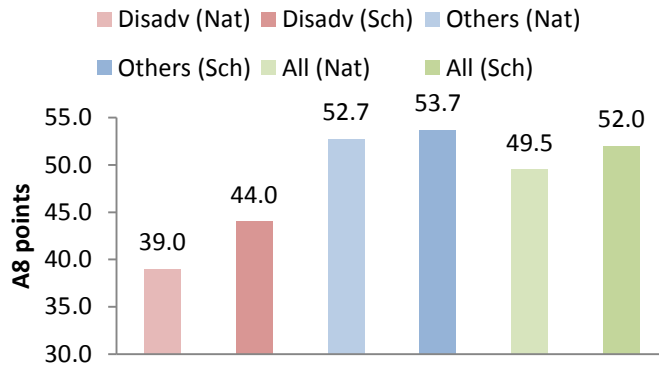
School figures (Sisra, 2016) and National figures (DfE, SRF 01/2016)

Attainment 8 (A8):

- The A8 in-school gap is smaller than the national attainment gap. The school gap is 9.7 points compared to the national gap of 13.7 points (Disadvantaged pupil is 39.0 (SFR 01/2016) and 52.7 points for Other pupils).
- When comparing the schools’ A8 score for Disadvantaged pupils against Other pupils nationally (44 v 52.7 pts), it stands as **8.7 points**.

EBacc: The EBacc was achieved by 16% of Disadvantaged pupils compared to 29% of Other pupils with 26% of All pupils achieving the Ebacc was at 26% (24% Nat 2015).

Destination Measures: The latest available data for destination measures (2013/2014) shows the overall percentage of disadvantaged pupils going into sustained education or employment/training is 92%.
