BORNEO 2027!

An exciting opportunity has arisen for current year 9 pupils at Malet Lambert. This would involve a trip for 12 pupils to go to Borneo, an island in Asia close to Indonesia and Singapore. The idea is for those pupils to fundraise money to pay for the 21-day expedition which would take place at the end of summer term in 2027 after pupils GCSE exams. The school will support pupils in fundraising as much as possible. Cost: £4995. Highlights include: A whitewater rafting experience, working with local communities, earn a PADI Diving

qualification and support the local orangutans whose habitat is under threat. SAFEGUARDING CORNER

PREVENTING CHILDREN FROM DEVELOPING EXTREME VIEWS AND BECOMING INVOLVED WITH EXTREME GROUPS

As we always say in safeguarding corner 'any of this could happen to any of our pupils' whether in school or out of school, whether on-line or in person, whether they are making great academic progress or are not yet on track, whether they attend well or need to improve their attendance.

Approaches to young people by extreme groups often start by attempting to develop a shared and increasing hatred towards a group of other people based on their religion or politics for example.

Increasingly, such groups will use the internet including chat rooms and gaming forums to test out the views of young people and develop a shared hatred. This process of "recruiting" people is called "radicalisation"

Key Terms

Extremism – vocal or active opposition to fundamental British values such as democracy, the rule of law and tolerance of different faiths and beliefs
Ideology – a set of beliefs

Terrorism – a violent action against people or property, designed to create fear and advance a political, religious or ideological cause

Radicalisation – the process by which a person comes to support and be involved with extremist causes

What to look out for?

- A sudden and increased focus on one particular way of thinking or one particular section of society such as a particular religion.
- Evidence of very targeted hateful language when the young person talks about a group.
- The use of negative terms when speaking that you have not heard them use before
- Reference to new people whom you have never met and who seem to only interact over the internet.
- A withdrawal from existing friends and family - over and above what you would expect.

How can you help and support?

Gently probe their thought process if they do express extreme views.

- Check their internet use in the way that you feel is best as a family- For example, does their browser history reveal specific focused searches for specific material?
- Find out from those closest friends whether they have noticed any of the changes you have noticed
- Get in touch with the school for a chat to see if we have noticed anything

THINGS TO REMEMBER

COLLECTING PUPILS FROM SCHOOL

If you are collecting your child from school, for whatever reason, you must bring ID, if someone else is collecting your child on your behalf, they must also bring ID and must be an emergency contact on our Arbor record.

PARENTS/CARERS VISITING THE SCHOOL

As you are aware we are a very large secondary school and staff time is always taken up with appointments and duties. If you do need a face to face appointment with any member of staff, you will need to book a pre-arranged appointment. Please contact the school to arrange this. Unfortunately, if you do decide to come to the school without an appointment, the time you will be waiting to see a member of staff cannot be determined.

FIZZY DRINKS AND ENERGY DRINKS/SWEETS

Please be reminded that pupils are not permitted to bring energy drinks or sweets and fizzy drinks into school. Any pupils found with any types of these drinks/sweets will have them confiscated and disposed of.

LUNCHTIME

You must ensure that your children have money in their ParentPay accounts to pay for their lunch each day.

YOUTH SUPPORT SERVICES – PUPILS AGED 13+

Once our pupils reach Year 9, we pass pupil information to our local authority and / or provider of youth support services as they have responsibilities in relation to the education or training of 13-19 year olds under section 507B of the Education Act 1996. This enables them to provide services as follows:

- youth support services
- careers advisers

A parent or carer can object to any information in addition to their child's name, address and date of birth being passed to their local authority or provider of youth support services by informing us via email to enquiries@maletlambert.hull.sch.uk. This right is transferred to the child / pupil once they reach the age 16. Data is securely transferred to the youth support service via encrypted email and is stored electronically and held for in accordance with the local authorities retention schedule.

MEDICAL CONSENTS

In an effort to try and reduce the amount of paper, we ask for 'once only' medical consent which will cover your child throughout their time at Malet Lambert. If you haven't already returned a signed form, you will receive an email asking for this.

The school should have up to date medical details at all times, we wouldn't expect a parent/carer to only update us if their child is going on a visit, so with this in mind can you please ensure that you are informing us of any changes to your child's medical records immediately, this can be done in the following ways:

BIOMETRIC CONSENT

As a school we use biometric finger scan technology for example in the dining halls. This data is held securely and further information can be found in the TEAL Data Protection Policy. Consent can be withdrawn at any time by writing to us at enquiries@maletlambert.hull.sch.uk

FREE SCHOOL MEAL ENTITLEMENT

Families who receive certain benefits may be eligible for free school meals, regardless of the child's age. Registering for free meals could also raise additional funds for your child's school, to fund valuable support like extra tuition, additional teaching staff or after school activities.

This additional money is known as the 'Pupil Premium Grant'.

To find out if your child is eligible the benefits team at your Local Authority can process your claim by telephone or alternatively you can complete the online form at <https://www.gov.uk/apply-free-school-meals>. If your child is eligible you will receive a confirmation letter from your Local Authority within 10 days. Upon receipt of this letter please do notify the school.
