Research from the PHS group found the following among teenagers nationally

- 25% said they had to make do without period products during their period
- 1 in 9 said they have missed school or college because they could not afford period products

Many pupils are very open about asking us when they require products, however, we are aware many do not feel comfortable.

This is something we are working to change and reduce the stigma around periods. Where they don't feel comfortable asking a member of staff in school, you can complete this form and we will organise for you to receive them.

As we do not know what the demand will be, therefore we are limiting to <u>4 items</u> per pupil based on estimated demand and stock. This may be reviewed, and we will communicate again if this changes. We also cannot guarantee stock and therefore will distribute initially by first come first served basis. We always have stock in school should a pupil require any in an emergency.

If you would like two of the same product, select two, and if you would like two different products, select 1 pack of each. We are limited with the range of products we have, therefore the ones listed are the only ones available.

E-Scooters

This week we are focusing on the legalities, issues and dangers around e-scooters It is estimated that there are now 750,000 e-scooters in use in the UK with the majority being used illegally.

Currently, electric scooters can only be used on private land with the landowner's permission. It is effectively illegal to use them on public roads, on pavements, in cycle lanes and in pedestrian areas.

E-scooters can achieve relatively high speeds of up to 30 mph which can result in significant injuries and even fatalities especially where collisions occur and helmets have not been worn.

Pupils should never be coming to school on an e-scooter for the reasons outlined above. Quite apart from all the issues of safety and legality, these are expensive items for which the school is not responsible in any way in the event of loss or damage. Pupils should have either submitted applications for their preferred college/apprenticeship courses, or be_on their way to doing so this month. A THINGS TO REMEMBER

COLLECTING PUPILS FROM SCHOOL

This right is transferred to the child / pupil once they reach the age 16. Data is securely transferred to the youth support service via encrypted email and is stored electronically and held for in accordance with the local authorities retention schedule.
